### **The Question:**

**'What might a sustainable farming system for Ceredigion look like?'**

**What needs to change?**

**What might we do locally?**

There will be a brief introduction followed by short talks from experts to cover a range of themes such as livestock farming, horticulture, wildlife, climate change, soil, water, rural communities, food supply etc. This will be kept as short as possible. It will be followed by in-depth small group discussion, to consider the questions. Each group will document their discussion and choose a spokesperson to report back to the main meeting.

The purpose of the event is to bring together all the different perspectives on farming in Ceredigion and come to a consensus on how we might move forwards. This might include recommendations for possible policy changes to enable a sustainable future at both a local and a national level.

We expect the People's Assembly to last for 2 hours, with the option to return if people wish to continue the discussion. This is an ambitious task for such a short time frame. However we may find that there are already some clear areas of consensus. At the very least it offers the opportunity to make connection with others in the field.
